Our Mission

The Catholic Centre for Immigrants:

- Promotes and facilitates the reception of newcomers to Canada;
- Sensitizes the community to address newcomers' needs and invites it to respond;
- Assists newcomers to realize their full potential in Canadian Society.

Our Principles

We Are Guided By the Following Principles:

- Commitment to social justice in all policies, programs and services;
- Provision of assistance to newcomers regardless of race, national or ethnic origin, religion, gender identity or expression, sexual orientation, age, mental or physical ability;
- Use of approaches that are empowering, client-centered, and that address the physical, psychological, social and spiritual dimensions of the person;
- Recognition of the central importance of the human resources of the Centre – volunteers, staff and members;
- Commitment to provide services in both official languages;
- Provision of multilingual services to newcomers;
- Commitment to work with related agencies, community organizations, and various faith groups, especially the parishes of the area, and;
- Accountability to stakeholders – funders, creditors and the community-at-large.

Our Services

Our Services To Newcomers Include:

- Temporary accommodations and housing assistance;
- Orientation about education, employment, health and other topics to help navigate life in Canada;
- Help with immigration documents and processes;
- Referrals and support to access other services;
- Help to connect and contribute to their new community;
- Assistance to improve fluency in English or French;
- Special programs for youth;
- Counselling.

Settlement

CCI is there to help newcomers realize their full potential in Canadian Society.

- **Housing**
 - Reception House and Welcome House are transitional housing for newcomers that provide meals, shared common areas and transportation, as well as programs, workshops and children's activities to help newcomers adjust to life in Canada.
- **Language**
 - Various programs allowing newcomers to practice their English skills and open up a world of possibilities.
- **Employment**
 - Resume writing, networking, navigating job sites, learning a second language and more.
- **Health**
 - Counselling for those suffering from trauma, or helping newcomers navigate the health care system – mental and physical health needs are a priority.
- **Education**
 - Helping newcomers enroll children into school, and helping youth explore post-secondary education opportunities.

Integration

CCI is there to help people adjust to daily life in Canada and become part of their new community.

- **Everyday Life**
 - Shopping for groceries, opening a bank account, taking public transit and other daily challenges.
- **Making Connections**
 - Introductions to community members to avoid isolation, making friends and learning about Canada.
- **Getting Out and About**
 - Exploring Ottawa through field trips with other newcomers and members of the community.
- **Strong Spirit**
 - Connecting newcomers with the faith community of their choice.

Community

CCI helps build a more welcoming community.

- **Volunteer Recruitment**
 - Learning about new cultures; meeting new people; sharing similar values and networks to build a more welcoming community.
- **Partnerships**
 - Working with partner organizations to help newcomers integrate and bring the most value to our community.
- **Raising Awareness**
 - Engaging with the community to share newcomer stories and discuss immigration through various platforms/mediums.
- **Set an Example**
 - Introduce yourself; be a friend; share a network, and; build a stronger more welcoming community.

- 1-on-1 connections with newcomers
- Sharing your Canadian experiences and introducing Canadian culture
- Introducing services and resources in the City of Ottawa
- Making connections to networks that support integration

Program Support

- Youth programs: education/tutors; sport and recreation program support (generally evenings)
- Employment: workshop facilitation; resume writing; job fairs
- Conversation Circles: encouraging newcomers to practice English language skills and interact with the community

Community Events Volunteers


- Short-term or one-time volunteer opportunities
